Tire Violations Serious for CSA

CSA, now, "Compliance Safety Accountability", does not create any new regulations; it only tightens the existing regulations. The major difference is drivers are now also monitored. If they drive a vehicle not in compliance, then it counts against them as well as the company. Tire violations are very serious (and always have been), because they are such a high safety risk. The majority of the tire violations are those that could cause a tire to rapidly lose pressure and render the vehicle "Out of Service." These count much higher against a fleet and driver in the point system and can be easily identify by the driver in a pre-trip inspection.

The Driver is the most important individual in making sure tires are not the cause for a citation.

Proper Tire Pressure Makes a Difference

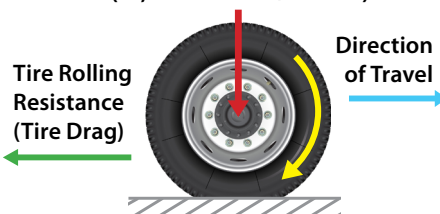
The condition and inflation of tires on heavy-duty trucks can make a significant difference in fuel economy. In fact, a truck can lose 1% of fuel efficiency for every 10 pounds PSI of underinflation. Tires should be checked often to ensure they are within the manufacturer's inflation specifications. Proper tire inflation pressure also helps optimize tire performance and stabilizes the tire's structure. It allows durability and performance designed to match the needs of the vehicles as well as blending the tire's responsiveness, traction and handling.

What is Tire Rolling Resistance?

The longitudinal (drag) force which acts opposite to the direction of the tire travel. Rolling resistance is the energy that is lost when the tire is rolling and the main reason for loss of energy is the constant deformation of the tire.

Many tire manufacturers recommend inflating the stored tires to their maximum rated pressure. The higher pressure puts less stress on the tire cables. Due to the fact that tires will lose 2 to 3 PSI per month, they need to be checked every two to three months.

To maintain proper tire air pressure, your tire gauge must be calibrated on a regular basis. A new truck stick gauge is accurate to a plus or minus 3 PSI. However, after it is dropped a few times, it may not be as accurate. It is important to calibrate stick gauges using a master gauge on a regular basis. Over time, any gauge can go bad, therefore, when you calibrate, it is important to check a range of pressures.

Tires represent one of the highest costs of running a fleet, second to fuel. Properly maintaining tires can help keep both of these costs in line this summer.
